

MAKE A SECOND WORLD WAR 3D DECORATION

During the Second World War it was very difficult to buy decorations for special occasions such as Christmas and birthdays. People would make their own decorations with resources found around the house.

You will need:

- A piece of coloured card
- A stencil/shape to draw around
- A pencil
- A piece of newspaper
- Scissors
- Glue



1. Fold your newspaper three times and draw around a shape on to the top piece.

2. Cut around the line of your shape. You should now have three identical newspaper shapes.

3: Glue one of the shapes onto the coloured card.

4. Fold the other two shapes in half length ways.

5. Glue the two shapes together along one edge.

6. Glue along the remaining edge and stick on to your first shape of the paper.

You now have a 3D decoration!



MAKE A HANGING LANTERN

You will need:

- An A4 sheet of coloured or scrap paper
- A strip of paper (25cm x 5cm)
- An edge spacer or ruler
- Scissors
- Glue or a stapler



1. Fold the piece of paper in half length ways.
2. Put the line spacer or ruler 2cm below one of the open edges and draw a line.
3. Keeping the paper folded, cut lines from the closed edge up to the line you have just drawn. Be careful not to cut past this line.
4. Open out your paper and decorate.
5. Pull together the two shorter edges of your paper in to a round tube. Glue or staple in to place.
6. Press it down slightly so that the middle pushes out.
7. Hook the long strip of paper in the top part and staple or glue in to place.
